Preview

- 1. Brainstorm connections to prior knowledge.
- 2. Predict what might we learn about the topic when we read the passage?

During reading

Click and Clunk

- 1. Were there any parts or words that were hard to understand (clunks)?
- 2. How can we fix the clunks? Use fix-up strategies:
 - Reread the sentence and look for key ideas to help you understand the word
 - Reread the sentences before and after looking for clues
 - Look for prefixes, suffixes, and root words in the word
 - Look for smaller words within a large word.

Get the gist

- 1. What is the most important who or what in this section?
- 2. What is the most important information in this section about the who or what?

After reading

Wrap-Up

- 1. Ask questions
 - What questions would check whether we understand the most important information in the passage?
 - Write different types of questions.
 - Who can answer the question?
 - Where did you find the information to answer that question?
